

Dubya 'indicted' on torture

GENEVA — Activists vowed yesterday that former President George W. Bush would face a torture case against him whenever he travels outside the United States.

Human-rights groups had planned to lodge a Swiss criminal case against Bush yesterday, before his address to a Jewish charity in Geneva on Feb. 12. Organizers canceled his speech last weekend, invoking security concerns.

But the Manhattan-based Center for Constitutional Rights and the Berlinbased European Center for Constitutional and Human Rights issued what they called a preliminary "indictment" to prosecute Bush abroad for the alleged torture of terrorism suspects in US custody.

"This is our way of putting him on notice," said Katherine Gallagher, senior staff attorney at the Center for Constitutional Rights.
