In the event any replacement or supplemental brief raises arguments not raised to the original panel, the parties should discuss whether those arguments are properly before us.

The appellant's brief--if any--shall be filed by September 23, 2008. The appellees' briefs--if any--and any briefs amicus curiae, shall be filed by October 28, 2008. Any reply brief shall be filed by November 4, 2008. While the briefing schedule of the parties is to be strictly observed, extensions of the time to file briefs amicus curiae will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Oral argument will be held on December 9, 2008 at 3 p.m. in the Ninth Floor Courtroom of the United States Courthouse, 500 Pearl Street, New York, New York.
